



#17 WILLIAMS, Earl D. ex 2EA, 2UC, W3AMI, W2CGY, W2EG. "Earl" b. 18 Aug 1894 sk 23 Oct 1964. 1st 2 way 1908. Ret. Electrical Inspector, Fire Underwriters. In 1907, Earl and another boy rode their bikes about 30 miles to the E.I.Co., in New York City and got some aerial wire, sliders silicon, tin-foil and a key. By "borrowing" a few things such as a spark coil and telephone receiver he got on the air. He is listed in the 1913 Govt. call book as 2EA. During WW2, he taught radio to Signal Corps people for Rutgers Univ. A PAST SECRETARY and TREASURER of OOTC.

#18 SPANGENBERG, Lester, ex 2IM, 2ZM, 2ZN, 2MB, W2MB. "Les". sk 1958. 1st 2 way 1906. Listed as 2IM in the 1913 Govt. call book.



#19 WOODWARD, Raymond W. ex W1VW, K4EW, WA4FVB. "Ray" b. 2 Nov 1893 sk 1975. 1st 2 way 1908. Ret. Director, Applied Res., Underwood Corp. Charter member ARRL. Inventor, "Hetrofil", a device for eliminating heterodyne interference. Physicist, National Bureau of Standards 1914-1921, Metallurgist and Consultant, Res. Lab., Underwood, 1933 to retirement. Lt. Col. and Comm. Officer, General Staff, Conn. State Guard. Member Mars. Received Conn. Medal for Distinguished Civilian Service.

#20 SABIN, Glenn C. W1ZS, ex 1MS, 1ZL, 1CGS, W1CGS, "Glenn". 1st 2 way 1906. In business with his son, in Northampton, where they repair practically everything in the electrical line, radios, 2 way comm. systems, amateur equipment etc. They also open and repair safes, along with being Bonded Locksmiths. Operated early high power spark signing 1ZL, in Northampton 1915. Broke many dx records of that time. Handled much traffic on 1st ARRL trunk lines.

#21 PICKARD, Dr. Greenleaf Whittier, ex W1FRU. "Pic". sk 8 Jan 1956. 1st 2 way 1898. He invented the crystal detector, the radio compass and devices for reducing noise. He was an engr. for AT&T Co., 1902-1906. Consulting engr. Wireless Specialty Co., 1907-1930 Independent consulting engr. for a number of years. Co-founder of Pickard and Burns, consulting engineers and Chairman of the Board from 1952 until his death. Fellow and past president IRE. Fellow, Radio Club of America. Member ARRL, American Meterological Society, etc.



#22 McINTIRE, M. A., W2BO, ex 2DF, 2BO, "Mac" b. 6 Sep 1896. 1st 2 way 1908. Retired. First licensed as 2DF 21 Dec 1912 and is listed in the 1913 Govt. Call Book. Member DXCC and QCWA. Served in USN WW1. SK



#23 WALKER, Edward C., ex 8AX, W8AX, W2EE. "Bud" sk 1974. 1st 2 way 1906. He also was known as Bud Kozak from the dry car wash, which is business he started in 1926.



#24 ABERCROMBIE, J. B., ex 9NH, 9AYM, 9GKK, 9CHE, WØNH. "Julius, Jack" b. 2 Mar 1893. sk. 1st 2 way 1904. Spark transmitter 2kw prior to 12 Dec 1912. 1st transoceanic contact New Zealand 1924. Built and operated bc station WEAK 1922, KGBX 1927, KGIZ 1930, rebuilt KFEQ 1933. Too old for service during WW2 so was engineer with FMS Lab., Kansas City, processing crystals (FT-243).

#25 HANSEN, Edmund H., ex 8AZ, 8JA, W6IZ.
"Ed". 1st 2 way 1908. sk 1962.

#26 BROUGHTON, Henry P., ex K2AE, "Henry".
sk 1959.

#27 CANHAM, William V., ex W3KBB. "Bill".
1st 2 way 1906. sk 1957.

#28 BALLARD, Dr. C. Palmer, ex 6RR, W6RR.
"Doc". sk 1953. 1st 2 way 1906.
