



#29 GREENE, Oliver W., W1CPI, ex 1CPI, "Skipper". b. 9 May 1902. Graduated from the Eastern Radio Institute, Boston, 1917. Went to sea in the transatlantic service on 15th birthday--for five years. Graduated from Bliss School of EE, Washinton, DC, 1923. Took 5 year GE course laboratory electrical analysis. Founded and owned Greene Plastics Inc., Wakefield, RI. Sold molding business in 1952 and built Quo Vadis Shopping Center. Owns largest collection of antique radio gear in the world.

#30 PRESTON, John, es W2GOX, "Pres" sk 17 Jul 1948. 1st 2 way 1906.

#31 BAILEY, William W., WB4BTX, ex 9ACP. W9AO, "Bill". 1st 2 way 1907.

#32 JOYCE, George E. ex 9RA, W9RA. "George" sk 1966. 1st 2 way 1907.



#33 DREYER, Harry W., K4NAR, ex W1ANC, K4HEN. "Harry" b. 8 Aug 1896. 1st 2 way 1906. Ret. Electronic Design Engr. Started with spark coil and carbon detector. Master Signal Electrician, Signal Corps, Air Service 1917-1919. Operated spark xmtr SCR-54 from Curtis Jennie plane. Designed and built 1st commercial ohmmeter for Roller-Smith Co. Electronics Engr., RCA Photophone, Yale University Medical School and broadcast station WNHC. Lt. USNR 1941-1943. Sent recording of VS6AH's cw signals and was made honorary member of the Hong Kong Amateur Radio Society.



#34 ISHERWOOD, William Lea, W1TP, ex 1LD, 1TP. Retired. "Bill" b. 21 Jan 1893. 1st 2 way 1908. Retired Automatic dial telephone foreman. 1st radio license, Certificate of Skill, issued at Brooklyn Navy Yard, 17 Apr 1912. Commercial 1st up to 1922. Call 1LD before WW1 and 1TP, and then W1TP from 1919 on. Operated on the old Massie system on the Sound steamers. Also Fessenden, United Wireless, and Marconi systems on ships out of Boston. SK

#35 WHITE, Dr. Elliot A. ex W1SP. "Doc". 1st 2 way 1904. For many years a professor of English at Dartmouth College. Director, New England Division, ARRL 1925-1928. He was an active member of the famous Dartmouth "Outing Club"



#36 JETTE, George H. ex 1UE, 1LAQ, W1UE. "Chief" b. 28 Apr 1892. sk. 3 Feb 1973. 1st 2 way 3 Jun 1907. Ret. CRM USN. 1st on the air at Central Falls, RI, signing "YD" and using American Morse. Licensed in 1912 as 1UE and is listed in the 1913 Govt. Call Book. Military training with the US Cavalry, Fort Ethan Allen, Vt., 1913. Joined US Navy in 1917 and retired in 1947.

#37 McVICKAR, Patrick W., ex W4ZB. "Pat".
sk 1960.



#38 RASER, Edward G., W2ZI, ex 3NG, 3CS, 3ZI, 3AOV, 3CMH, W8GHY, W3ZZB. "Ed". b. 1 Apr 1899. 1st 2 way 1910. Ret. Supvr. Engr. N.J. State Police radio system. On the air continuously since commercial opr. Still holds comml 1st class license. Joined ARRL in 1915 operating official relay stn. to date. Co-founder Dela. Valley Radio Assn. Owner "W2ZI Museum and Library". Mem. VWOA, RCA, A-A Oprs. Club, DeForest Pioneers, MARS, AWA, APCO, Sen. Mem. IEEE.



#39 BARTON, Larry J., ex 6LB, W6OCH, W6YI. "Larry". b. 21 May 1896. sk. 1963. 1st 2 way 1906. Consultant to Proctor & Gamble. Brig. General US Air Force. Graduate of Leland Stanford University, 1917. Listed as 6LB in the Govt. Call Book.

#40 ROBB, Robert R., ex W2QZM. "Bob".
