"Joe" sk 13 Feb 1952. 1st 2 way 1906.

#42 DAMON, Ralph H., ex K4CS, W1AJ. "Ralph"
b. 10 Sep 1891. 1st 2 way 1906. Ret. Technician,
Raytheon Mfg. Co. Experimented with coherers &
decoherers, electrolytic & crystal detectors,
slide tuners, loose couplers, spark coils, a
crude wireless telephone in 1909, hv transformers
& a 87' mast. Served as CRM USN WW1, aboard DD42
USS Jenkins also temporary duty after war at NAD
& NPX at San Pedro, California.

#43 KENYON, Harold P. ex 8DAQ, W8DAQ.
"Harold" sk 1967 1st 2 way 1908.

#44 GOULD, Joseph. ex W1DLH, W4VCM.
"Joe" sk 1953 1st 2 way 1908.

#45 RIDLEY, Arthur E., ex 1DJ, W1DJ.
"Art" sk 1957. 1st 2 way 1902.



#46 McINTYRE, David H., ex W2KYH, W4VXR.
"Mac" sk 4 Jan 1971. 1st 2 way 1908.



#47 SEED, Robert D., ex 1ARO, W1PJM.
"Bob" b. 21 Feb 1900. sk 1968. 1st 2 way
1909. Was Maintenance Supervisor for
Worcester County Electric Co. First rig
was a spark coil, silicon detector and a
75 ohm telephone receiver, in Montreal.
Moved to Worcester in 1914 and obtained
first amateur operator's license in 1916.
First station license 1ARO in 1922.



#48 ELLSWORTH, Charles B. ex W1TU, W2TQ.
"Charley" b. 30 Nov 1892. sk 1968. 1st 2
way 1908. Started with the Canadian Marconi
Co., in 1911. Was one of the operators at
Cape Race, Newfoundland, MCR, when the RMS
Titanic sank on 14 Apr 1912. The CQD from
MGY, the Titanic, was heard off Cape Race
and much traffic was handled. During WW1,
he was a Chief Radioman at NBD, Bar Harbor,
Maine. He received a letter of commendation
from President Wilson for traffic handling with
the USS George Washington, July 1919, when the
President was aboard.

#49 ELLINGHAM, Irving. ex 2DK, W2DK.
"Irving" 1st 2 way 1908.

#50 BEAN, Harold W. ex 1CZ, 1OE, W1OE.
"Harold" sk 20 Oct 1961 1st 2 way 1908.



#51 STERLING, George E., W1AE, ex 1AE, 3DF, W2DF "George" 1st 2 way 1908. Listed as 1AE in the 1913 Govt. Call Book. Radio Inspector, Inspector in Charge, Radio Service, Bureau of Navigation, Department of Commerce. Served as Lt. Signal Corps, WW1, under General Pershing. Chief of Radio Intelligence Div., FCC during WW2. Located over 200 Nazi spy radio stations. Chief Engr. of FCC, also Commissioner FCC. Federal Radio Commission and FCC 1923-1954. Represented US in several International Frequency Allocation Conferences. Author of "The Radio Manual". 4 editions, 150,000 copies. PAST PRESIDENT of OOTC.
