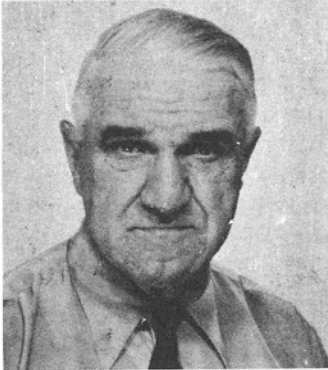


#69 COOK, Joseph F. Col. Ex-W1QTI SK 1956

#70 DUNN, Perly B., Ex-W6WPF, Ex-W6ZX. Handle "Jack". Born September 22, 1894. South Portland, Maine. First 2-way wireless contact 1907. Occup: Electronics Inspector, Northrup Aircraft Inc., First contact was with Naval Station at Cape Elizabeth 5 miles. Active until 1911 then started with United Wireless at Boston. Worked Irv Vermilya, W1ZE, when he used to run into Portland on old JD (Later KJD) Northland with "Hipockets" Hilkins. U.S. Navy 1913-1945. Operated 40 meters from NPG (with Naval permission) which resulted in first hi-frequency operation on Pacific Coast for Naval Communications. November 1, 1962 appointed OOTC Awards Chairman.



#71 RIGBY, Townsend J., W7COH, Ex-6DU. Handle "Rig". Born November 5, 1891. First 2-way wireless contact 1906. Occup: Electrical Engineer (Ret.). First amateur and commercial license in 1912. Operated aboard ships for Marconi Co.. Copied first message from an aeroplane in flight in 1912. Licensed 6DU 1912. First RCVR crystal detector & Navy type loose coupler 1908, moved to Wyoming and received call W7COH 1931. SCM for Utah, Wyo. 2 yrs. active in traffic handling. Member AARS. Formed Hell Gate Radio Club, (twice) President 1st time. Started DC activity and Missoula Area Emergency Net on 75 meter phone.

#72 JOHNSON, Albert E., W1RYB. Handle "Al". First 2-way wireless contact 1911. Off air 1917, returned 1949, retired N.Y. Central Railroad (Now Penn Central) early Rig 1 inch Spark coil-loose coupler straight gap. Brandeis Ear-phones.
