#74 FORD, Warren A., W2GTB, Ex-1HBA, IBEA, 2DAA. Handle "Warren". Born September 19, 1894. First 2-way wireless contact 1911. Retired-GE Co. Electro-Mech. Eng'r on radio, Electronics and Radar. Rensselaer Polytech 1916, 1917 interrupted by service in U.S. Navy 1918 and 1919, served as Radio instructor USN Radio School, Harvard University, then as Radio Engineer Bureau of Steam Engineering Wash., D.C. on high power radio stations. From 1922 to 1923 Radio Engineer, WEAJ. Member of IRE, OOTC, and ARRL. Citation from Britain for work on Radar Jammers during WW2.

#75 CUTTING, Irving E., W1LV, Born June 9, 1892. Handle "Irving". First 2-way wireless contact 1912. Retired Uni-Royal Technologist, WW1 U.S. Navy (Electrician-Radio) 1918-1919.



#76 OGG, Glen R., Ex-W6VCV. Handle "Glen". Born December 5, 1885. First 2-way wireless contact 1907. Occup: U.S. Navy (Ret.). Learned telegraphy at Union Depot of Great Northern RR in Minneapolis while going to high school. 1907 joined Navy as EM3/C and was sent to Elect. School at Brooklyn. After graduating as EML/C & Wireless Operator sent to U.S.S. Alabama. 1907-1909 made trip around world with U.S. Fleet. Was in class of 16 men receiving instruction aboard Flagship U.S.S. Connecticut in De Forest wireless telephone. 1910-1911 was at Brooklyn Navy Yard Station NAH. Served continuously until retired October 1939. Operates 40 meters CW, 10 & 2 phone.
