

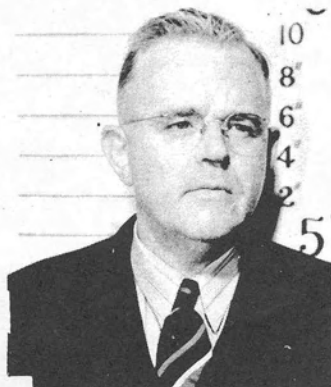
#101 MERIROWITZ, David, WLEG. Handle "Dave". First 2-way wireless contact 1910.

Holds Extra Class License. Radio news ideal ham station 1944. Amateur Dream Station 1956 C.R. Gazette. WØCVU Gold Cup won by OK1MB. WØCVU Gold Plaque for 200th country confirmed won by HKØTU. Has 215 countries confirmed on 2-way SSB. Holds DXCC, CQ200, WAZ, WPX, WAC, BERTA, TPA, WAP, WAS CHC, RSGB, DRD, 101, WCBN, CCC, WBE. First and only amateur awarded the Empire DX certificate on 2-way SSB.

Operator afloat and ashore including 5 years. U.S.N., RMC. Served as Chief Engr. several radio mfg. plants. Asst. U.S. Rdo. Insp. 8th District (1912-1923). Marine Rep. RCA Chicago Div. (1924-1932). Contractor for Govt. Radio Inst., (1932-1940). Joined CAA 1940. Transferred to U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service 1957. Ret. 1958. Time now devoted exclusively to writing electronic articles.



#104 HERLAND, John N., W2MDB, Ex-1JY, W2BPF. Handle "John". Born February 17, 1896. First 2-way wireless contact 1906. Present occup: Master Mech., Nesco Steel Co. First Amateur call 1JY 1912-1917. Then W2BPF. First Class Commercial License 1913. Worked for old Marconi Co. as wireless operator during summer vacations. In 1917 enlisted in the Signal Corps. and was commissioned a 1st Lt. "Put aside childish things to get married, only to acquire present cass as soon as Jr. Operator came along." Work 40, 20, 15 SSB and CW-occasionally 2 meters.
