



#129 BROUGHTON, Wm. G., W2IR. Handle "Bill". Born January 12, 1902. First 2-way wireless contact August 1914.



#130 FOGARTY, John J., W4CI. Handle "John". Born May 1, 1897. First 2-way wireless contact 1916. Occup: Industrial Sales Manager, Tampa Electric Co. Started with a spark coil and crystal detector. Enlisted in Navy April 13, 1917, and got out in 1919 as Chief Electrician (R.). First Class Commercial License in November 1919 and went to sea as wireless operator 1919 to 1921. With Tampa Electric Co. 1921 to 1962. Retired in June 1962 but company requested him to stay on for a while.



#131 PILGRAM, George W., Sr., WØHU, Ex-9HU, 9DWF, WØDWF. Handle "George". Born March 18, 1898. First 2-way wireless contact 1911. First license in March 1914, 9HU until shut down by government. Served in U.S.N.R. Class V-3 from Sept. 4, 1931 to Sept. 4, 1935 radioman 1st Class. Receiver Public Service Award from ARRL Jan. 6, 1953 for services rendered in connection with Midwest floods of April 1952 as recounted in QST for Aug. and Sept. 1952. Holds Extra Class License. Member of ARRL, Old Timer's Club, and Old Old Timers Club. Operates phone primarily around 3900 KC, also 800 Watt CW rig.

#132 BRADSHAW, Norwood V., W2ELN, Ex-2AUR, 2BXT, and 1ESP. Handle "Brad". Born October 11, 1895. First 2-way wireless contact 1914. Present occup: Retired Electronic Engr. Radio Officer on 22 merchant vessels. "Spent a very terrifying night in a hurricane at sea once and will never forget it. I was on a coal collier with radio equipment inoperative. We would have sunk like a plummet if the old tub had sprung a leak." Went to sea after graduating from RCA Institute, N.Y. Worked at 7 different local broadcasting stations as transmitter engineer. Member of OTC, ARRL, and Rag Chewers Club. ARRL code Profic. 35 WPM.
