Received first license and call 7CG 1915. First Class Comm. License 1916. Went to sea Alaska SS. Co. April 1916 - April 1917. Joined Navy Feb. 1919 as El (R) 1st Class-made Chief El (R) 1918. In Navy was stationed at KPA, Seattle; NPC Bremerton; U.S. Sub-chaser 294; and Trans-Atlantic Radio, Wash., D.C. Seven Years after war ran garage and elect. business in Palouse. Built and sold B.C. receivers, wired houses. Sold business and went to farming. 1933 got Extra Class License and W7CG.



#134 SAYLES, Ralph H., W8ZJ, Ex-8NV, 8IZ, W8ERJ. Handle "Ralph". Born July 5, 1900. First 2-way wireless contact 1915. Occup: Supt. of Fremont Division of Toledo Edison Co. First license 8NV 1915. Had ½ kw Thordarson XFMR, rotary gap, etc. Received First Class Comm'l license 1917 and operated on Lakes 1917-1918-1919 during school vacations. Was on S.S. W.F. White, S.S. City of Cleveland, S.S. Juniata, S.S. Tionesta, and S.S. Wyandotte, all spark. After WWI was 8IZ with 25 cycle fluttering note. Married 1923 no wireless until 1931, resumed as W8ERJ. 1952 granted W8ZJ. Member Ohio Soc. Prof. Engrs.; F & AM; H1-12, Exchange Club; Gr. Lakes Hist. Soc.



#135 WATSON, Paul G., Ex-W3BO, 3BV, 2CJU. Handle "Paul". First 2-way wireless contact 1912. Cmdr. USNR (Ret.). Grad. Pratt Institute EE 1923. Comm. Rdo. Oper. 1918-23. Radio Inspector U.S. Shipping Board 1923-24. U.S. Radio Inspector, Savannah, Ga., 1924-26. Radio Director Finder Engr., RCA, 1927-28. Plant Engr., Eastern Malleable Iron Co., Del. 1928-40. Shop Supt. U.S. Navy Yard, Phila., 1940-46. Had control of production more than 100 ships during WW2. About 30 articles published in radio journals. Member Am. Legion, Soc. of Amer. Mltry Engr., De Forest Pioneers, Soc. Naval Arch. & Engrs., has wonderful collection electron tubes.
