Worked for Massie Wireless Co., United Wireless, Marconi, Fessenden, and Revenue Cutter Service at time of Titanic disaster. U.S. Navy on the Cyclops, Nereus Jason, etc. Radio Engr. Air Mail P. O. Dept. 1924. President Brunswick Radio of Canada and Brunswick of South America with factories in Rio, Buenos Aires and Santiago, Chile.



#166 MCKEE, William J. Jr., W1KC, Ex-W4TT, W1AFA. Handle ""Bill"". Born June 4, 1907. First 2-way wireless contact October 5, 1916. Present occup: Sales Representative Gulf Oil Corp. Started out with a spark transmitter in 1916. Went to Georgia Tech worked in Radiation Laboratory. At MIT during WW2 on radar. Holds 2 public service awards from ARRL for work during northeastern flood August, 1955., and Worcester Tornado, June 1953. Member of International Amateur Radio Union and ARRL. Holder of advanced class ticket.



#167 RODERICK, Eugene R., W7ZH, Ex-K4KXP. Handle "Gene". Born March 3, 1898. First 2-way wireless contact July 15, 1912. Occup: (Ret.) Republic Steel Corp. First on air as 8ZW in Cleveland 1912. First contact with 8KS, 8HB, and 8 DT. Also operated at YWCA Club station at Canton, Ohio 1910. Have private pilots license and for a while during WW2 was Commander of a CAP Squadron. Besides the OOTC, he belongs to ARRL and is an 00 for same, belongs to Miami Amateur Radio Association, all Masonic Bodies and Shrine. Works SSB and RTTY all bands 10 thru 80.



#168 THOMPSON, Eunice Randall, W1MPP. Handle "Eunice". Born October 5. First 2-way wireless contact 1920. Former occup: Electric Utility Dept. Head (Maps and Diagrams). First spark transmitter, later demolished by lightning, remotely controlled half mile from shack. Artistic-knits, hooks, paints, signs, needlepoints, fires (ceramics), hams. Dreams of sub-stations, transmission lines, and industrial loads in terms of millions of kilowatts. Has First Class Comm. Ticket-was formerly very active in Eastern Mass. AM, Radio Assoc.
