First amateur license 1913. Commercial First Class License 1914-1925. U.S. Naval Radio Service Feb. 17, 1917-Feb. 17, 1919. At MIT 1919-1923; on MIT EE staff 1923-1928. Chief Engr. WBET 1923-1925; also Radio Editor Boston Evening Transcript 1922-25. General Radio Co. 1928-1957. Inventor of "Clapp Oscillator". Works CW only!

#175 AHOLA, Sylvester, W1PU. Handle "Sylvester". Born May 24, 1902. First 2-way wireless contact 1919. Licensed in Boston custom house 1919, 1PU. Known as Sylvester, virtuoso of the trumpet formerly featured in London, at hotels Savoy and Mayfair on "His Masters Voice" records with Ray Noble and Bert Ambrose. In this country featured on radio programs, Fred Allen with Peter Van Steeden, Cavalcade of America, Lux Theatre, etc. Recorded for 35 recording companies and 3 motion picture studios. More, but no room! Founder of Deep Sea Dragnet, 3970 KC noontime net.



#176 DEWAR, Allen S., W1RBH. Handle "Allan". Born September 13, 1899. First 2-way wireless contact Oct. 17, 1913. Retired. Built his first "wireless set" from instructions contained in the Boy Scouts Handbook published in 1911. Station was dismantled during WW1 and was off the air until 1948. Amateur radio is one of his hobbies. Prefers leisurely contacts both stateside and DX and is particularly interested in antennas.
