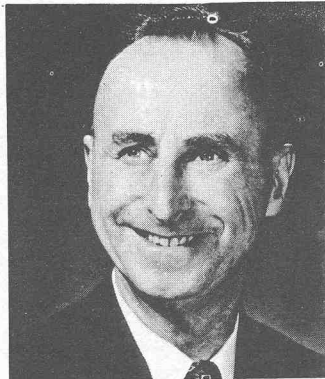




#205 BERG, Alex, G. Ex-W5AEY. Handle "Al". Born Jan. 18, 1897. First 2-way wireless contact 1909. Occup: Electronic Development Coordinator. Was ham until First Class Commercial License obtained 1913. Operator for American Marconi until WWI, then as CRM USN assigned to Seagate Station, then to Sayville Transoceanic Station, and back to sea again. Stayed in electronic field with RCA, ERPI (Western Electric), Bendix-Westinghouse, and few others. Last 5 years with Temco Electronics and Missles Co. in Garland. On air Sunday mornings, 20 meters, CW only.



#206 BURNS, James F., Ex-W3KOU. Handle "Jim". Born Mar. 15, 1901. First 2-way wireless contact 1916. Occup: Baltimore Coach Co. Started out as Morse man. Bit by wireless bug in 1912. Made first money for wireless gear as water boy on Mohawk Trail. Wireless operator U.S. Calvary, U.S. Air Service, U.S. Navy, U.S. Coast Guard, Munson Line. Life Memb. VWOA. First amateur to work the "Old Man" from air and LAW Nov. 11, 1922. Held DX record for aircraft in flight and ground 1921. Chief Rdo. Opr. in charge of Army Air Force bombing off Virginia Capes 1923.



#207 DALY, John F., Ex-W1SEO, Ex-W5GVP, W2TDG. Handle "Doc". Born Oct. 12, 1905. First 2-way wireless contact 1918. Present occup: Physician (Dermatologist). First licensed call W5GVP in Pawhuska, Oklahoma. W2TDG-Bellmore, L.I., N.Y. W1SEO-1949.

#208 TAYLOR, Floyd F., Ex-W7BX, Ex-7BX, 6AQY, 6BJI, 7MU, 7KI, U7KI, W60JY, W5AKL, W4IHO, W7JVM. Handle "Duffy". Born June 23, 1900. First 2-way wireless contact 1914. Occup: Sr. Power Station Operator, Bonneville Power Admin. Started in Burley, Idaho with Ford coil and crystal det. Received a Thordarson Xformer & Benwood gap for Xmas; Navy type coupler, Brandies Fones, and DeForest audion for birthday. First license 1916. Held Comm. Rdo. Oprs. License went to sea in 1920. Is a veteran of WW1. Went to CW in '21 with a VT-2 First with raw AC then with Kenotron tube rec. Present rig 300 watt CW & AM fone, HQ-170 receiver.
