First rig 1" spark coil and fixed gap, audiotron tube, honeycomb coils Murdock variable, and Baldwin phones. Obtained Commercial First Class License 1919 and shipped on S.S. Lake Lillian. Shipped on several ships and visited many countries of world. 1922 was original engineer at WOR, Newark. Operated antenna manufacturing business and two radio stores until depression 1930. Then employed by Keystone Aircraft Co., Bristol, Pa. in experimental and technical phases.



#227 GUPTILL, Donald F., W1AOG. Handle "Don". Born July 19, 1905. First 2-way wireless contact December 1920. Retired occup: Automotive Service. First transmitter spark coil and crystal detector, then ½kw spark and regenerative receiver. Now using Globe Champion 300 watts and HQ-110 receiver. Work 2-10-15-20-40 meter band.



#228 APPLEBY, Thomas Sk, Ex-W3AX. Handle "Tom". Born May 10, 1886. First 2-way wireless contact 1908. Retired. Experimented 1899. First amateur in Philadelphia 1908 listed in Bluebook Wireless Association of America. Wireless operator aboard "Capt. A.F. Lucas", for United Wireless 1909, and Mgr. United Wireless Atlantic City, "AX". 1911 opened First Comm. Wireless School in U.S. Opr. Wanamaker-Marconi Station "WHE". 1913 Member IRE, 1917-1919 Lieut. USN Communications. 1921-1940 Patent Attorney and Consultant Engineer. WW2 Lieut. Cmdr. USNR under Op. Nav. Member practically all radio clubs and associations.
