



#241 HOFFMAN, Enoch F., W2BI, Ex-W1BH. Handle "Een". Born August 17, 1904. First 2-way wireless contact Feb. 23, 1921. Present occup: Sales Engineer. Charter member of South Shore Amateur Radio Club of Quincy, Mass. Made numerous demonstrations to local police departments on mobile 5 meters in 1928-1929. Operated extensively in New England under call sign W1BH at Weymouth, Mass. Also known for his work from Pitman, N.J., call W3BHJ, where he helped many local boys to become amateurs. He is still active on 75 meter phone. SK



#242 CUNDALL, Lincoln A., Ex-W2LC, W2QY, Ex8ADI, 10Q. Handle "Link". Born June 13, 1899. First 2-way wireless contact 1916. Retired 1965 Supervisor Machine Design, Eastman Kodak Co., First license 1916 8ADI, 2nd license 1919 10Q. Started with single slide tuning coil, 75 OHM single C.I. Body Phone-no insulators on 4-wire aerial, just wood spools. Graduated to loose coupler and Ford spark coil (see cover May 1916 QST). Stayed up late one night and picked up NAA-10 PM. His first receiver and transmitter in Antique Wireless Association Museum.



#243 WALKER, Earl E., W2EE, Ex-8AX. Handle "Bud". First 2-way wireless contact 1906.



#244 CARON, George R., W1EQ. Handle "George" Born October 23, 1899. "My baptism into ham radio took place in September 1911, when I watched a QSO between 2 local hams. Two other fellows beside myself became interested and in 1912 we set up a 3-way transmitting layout within a four mile radius. Am now active on CW and SSB. Rig is a Collins KWS-1 and 75A4 with a W3DZZ beam. Am in top ten of the WPX CW award group and have 274 countries for DXCC. Have 29 CHC certificates."
