



#356 SNOW, Philip Putnam, Ex-W1EJW, Ex-1JBT. Handle "Hil". Born December 15, 1899. First 2-way contact 1915. Occup: Senior Electronic Technician. Norwich University 1923. Early rig: 1914-17 Ford spark coil and Galena detector. 1917 obtained 2nd Class Commercial Radio Operators License. 1917 to 1919 in U.S.N. as RMIC 1919-21 served on U.S.S. Texas, U.S.S. Leurathan, U.S.S. Isreal. 1921-25 had call 1JBT, 1KW and rotary gap 1947-62 active on CW only with present rig, ranger with pair of 813's 500w-TA33 Mosley beam. Attended Eastern Radio Institute 1917.



#357 GROVE, Luther B., W3KQH. Handle "Lute". Born Sept. 25, 1897. First 2-way wireless contact 1919. Occup: Qual. Control Rep. USA Signal Corps. 1917-18 Dodge Institute, 1918 U.S. Navy at Great Lakes and Camp Perry Radio School, 1918-19 U.S. Navy Radio School at Harvard. Comm. Radio Opr. from Sept. 1919 to 1927 with time out for Finley Engr. College. Kansas City, Mo. Graduated EE 1925. Employed by Cuyamel Fruit Co., New Orleans, on ships, and about 4 years at their land stations El Gallo, "CF", and Rio Grande Bar "CD", in Nicaragua. Held Commercial License from 1918-32, also amateur station license 1931 to date.



#358 SNOW, George, Jr. Ex-K3GVZ, Ex-8CYV. Handle "George". Born November 1, 1894. First 2-way wireless contact 1915. Occup: Retired from Real Estate Business. Received first license in year 1915. With Hand Green (*ANK), and ex-commercial operator, established at station and operated it jointly until it was shut down for WW1. Enlisted in U.S. Army Infantry and served in France. Had his license renewed on return. Is a member of American Legion and VFW. Retired on a 20 acre farm 25 miles north of Pittsburgh.
