



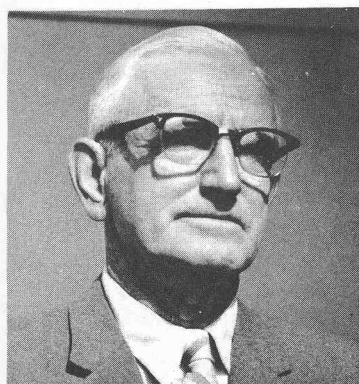
#368 GASTON, M.H., Ex-W5CZ. Handle "Homer". Born April 30, 1903. First 2 way contact 1913. Occup: State Defense Manager, Southern Bell Tel. & Tel. Co. Was 4AE prior to and after WWI. Then W5EBB in 1932.



#369 SPRINK, Theodore A., Ex-W2CH, Ex-W4AW, 2ANK, 2BQZ, 2CWZ, K6DK. Handle "Ted". Born June 12, 1903. First 2-way contact, March 1919. Occup: Staff Supt. Service Division Western Electric Co., Albany area. Will terminate 41½ years service on March 25, 1964. Early rig, 1KW spark, Sync and non sync with Benwood Gap, 4 wire flat top, member Imperial Valley Radio Club, Albany Radio Club, Q.C.W.A., O.O.T.C.



#370 KELLY, Charles M. Jr., Ex-K1GAD, Ex-W1AKY, K2BOL. Handle "Mike". Born May 10, 1891. First 2-way contact, Fall of 1910. Occup: Engineer Western Electric Bell Labs. A.T. & T. Co. E.R.P.I. Headmaster Hackley School (Ret.). BS in EE University of Maine 1914. Early rig: Mesco spark coil, Galena detector, tuning coil, tubular variable condenser, during WWI only commissioned officer in Navy who could handle guard watch for entire fleet, received Sec'y Navy's commendation. Formerly member I.R.E. and AIEE, Acoustical Society of America, now member ARRL, OOTC, Army, Navy Club, Washington, D.C.



#371 NICHOLSON, Knox W., Ex-K6DG. Handle "Knox". Born August 19, 1894. First 2-way wireless contact 1910. Occup: Retired Citrus Grower, California. Started with Coherer and Dechoerer and various crystals, half inch spark coil; then Galena and electrolytic detectors, quarter KW Blitzen transformer with rotary spark gap, condenser and Helix plus and hot wire ammeter. Obtained commercial first class license in 1913 and 1917. He was a 2nd Lt. in the U.S. Army Signal Corp in France 1917-1919. Was listed in the 1913 Government Call Book.
