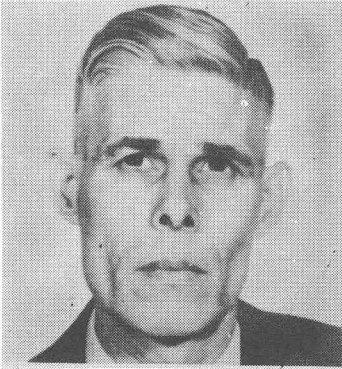
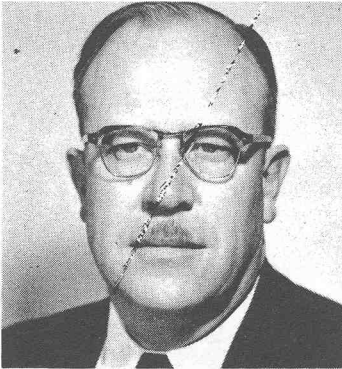

Occup: Radio Supervisor, James Millen Mfg. Co. for 24 years at Malden, Mass. Early rig Amrad spark coil, 4 wire flat top in November 1923 built tube reg, as per page 55 of QST. for Nov. 1923. Member of ARRL, OES, OBS, QCWA, E.C. for Everett, Mass. Also also CD for Everett.



#430 HUTCHESON, John A., K3ZVH, Ex-9AQK, W1BKK. Handle "Hutch". Born Jan. 21, 1905. First 2-way contact, 1919. Occup: Vice President, Technical Operations and Planning, Atomic, Defense and Space Group, Westinghouse Electric Corp. Early rig loose coupler, var. condenser, Galena detector, spark coil, gap, Helix and flat top ant. Member IRE Fellow.



#431 LAZARUS, Ben N., Ex-W2JB, Ex-U2JB. Handle "Ben". Born Feb. 14, 1894. First 2-way contact, July 1908. Occup: Retired from WMGM/WHN as Broadcast Engineer 1962. Amateur Canada 1908-14. Marconi operator 1914-17. U.S. Navy 1917-19. Independent Wireless Tel. Co., 1919-24. Then to broadcast. Early rig, spark coil, spark gap, Helix and 6 wire L antenna, sliding coil tuner Coherer-Decoherer detector, 75 OHM ear-phones. Member Canadian Central Wireless Club, QCWA, Charter and Life Member Veterans Wireless Operators Assn., NYC.
