Occup: Manufacturer of Antennas (Mosley Electronics, Inc.), graduated in 1926 Iowa State College; was employed by Union Electric Co. of St. Louis, Mo. from 1926-35. Was employed by W.N. Matthews Copr. 1936-49, self employed 1950 to present time. Hobby besides radio-magic. Favorite sport fishing. Early rig, Ford spark coil with Galena detector, then changed to tube type trans. 5 watter with Borax jar rect. 12 wire cage antenna, 60 ft long & 35 ft high. Member Old Timers Club, IEEE, International Brotherhood of Magicians, Mount City Radio Amateurs, St. Louis Flats.

Early rig crystal detector, loose coupler, ford coil, tubes 199 201a, 210, etc. and on several occasions nearly electrocuted myself. Worst shock being 2000 volts from left to right hand.
