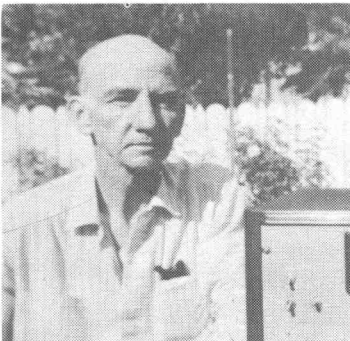

Had Call 8HD in Jackson, Mich., prior to WWI. Moved to L.A. in 1918. Obtained Call 6LC, Feb. 1920. Had spark from then to 1922, then moved to Santa Barbara and worked for SCE Co. 37 years, mostly on appliance repair. Had low power C.W. Member of Los Angeles Amateur Radio Club and Santa Barbara Amateur Radio Club. S.K. 1974.



#560 MYERS, W. Howard, W6OL, Ex-WB6KIF. Handle "Howard". Born Nov. 17, 1908. First 2-way contact, Spring 1923. Occup: Professor of Mathematics, San Jose State College, Ph.D. Stanford Univ., 1939. Have taught at Stanford and University of Utah. Early rig, WWI spark gap set. Member of ARRL, Phi Beta Kappa Sigma XI.



#561 BRANNIN, James W., Ex-K6JC, 5OK, W2BYE, W5DCI, W6OVK. Handle "Jim". Born Dec. 5, 1905. First 2-way contact 1920. Occup: Electronic Engineer, Southern Pacific Railroad, Communications Dept. Worked as Tel. Operator Western Union, Postal Brokers, Pipe Lines and Railroads 1924-42, Staff Engr. MIT Radiation Lab. 1942-43, Radar Field Engr. Submarine Signal Co., present position since February 1946. Early rig Ford spark coil, 4 wire flat top, audiotron regn., receiver. Member of ARRL and Nor. Calif. DX Club, and MARS. S.K.



#562 ANDERSON, J. William, W6QV, Ex-8QU, W6EIH, W6EIT. Handle "Andy". Born October 28, 1897. First 2-way contact 1915. Communications, City of Los Angeles, Power Engr. with Western Electric, Chief Electrician during building of Colorado River Aqueduct, Chief Electrician Engineer on Basic Magnesium Plant in Henderson, Nevada. First rig, Ford spark coil, mother oats tuner with slider, Galena detector then up thru 1 kw Clapp-Eastham. Have belonged in the past to AIEE and IRE, several Radio Clubs. Now retired.



#563 MUMFORD, Edgar Royal, W3CU, Ex-7CW, 7CU, 7ZJ, W7AZX. Handle "Ed or Roy". Born May 23, 1898. First two way contact 1916. Occup: Retired Engineering Writer, Westinghouse 1961, Commander USNR 1951, Radio Operator on USS Oregon 1918. Early rig, 1 kw spark, rotary Gap, regn. receiver. Member ARRO, QCWA.
