



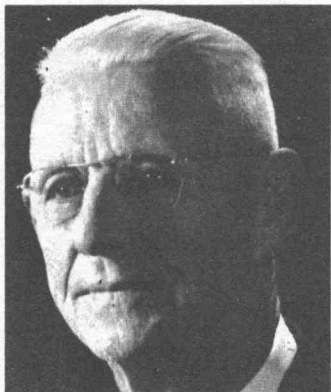

#567 CASTNER, Harold W., Ex-LUQ, 1BI, W1IIE. Born November 16, 1888, First two way contact before 1912. Occup: Retired. Worked at the Bath Iron Works, all during WW2, on radar, radio and sonar. We turned out a destroyer every two weeks. I was one of the 35 special navy men who established the Transatlantic Communication Service of the Navy. And operated at Bar Harbor, Maine. Early rig, loose coupler, copper Helix, spark coil, hand made key, Murdock phones. Member, Portland Radio Club, 1912, Navy Cross WW1, Close associate to Hiram Percy Maxim. S.K. 1970.



#568 JOHNSON, Charles F.H., Jr., K2ED, W2IUUV, Ex-2ED. Handle "Charlie". Born June 26, 1906. First 2-way contact early 1922. Occup: Farmer, Univ. of Penna., Graduate 1930.
