

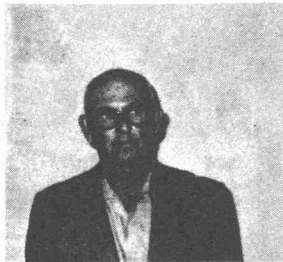
#684 CAMILLO, Matthew, W2WB, Ex-1HJ, 1CGR. Handle "Matty". Born July 9, 1905. First two way contact 1920. Occup; Radio Technician-Technical Operations, CBS-TV in NYC. Went to sea 15 years, had 5 years in Broadcasting, and last 25 years (1966) with CBS-TV. Was also Marine Radio Inspector, RCA and CAA, in early days. Enjoy Rag Chewing, Member QCWA, Masonic Orders, ARRL, Radio Operators Union, Radio and TV Broadcasting Engineers, et al. Early rig, Ford spark coil. (Makes one or two trips at sea every summer.).



#685 NOCK, Rupert A., K1SGO. Handle "Rupe". Born March 6, 1905. First two way contact 1919. Occup: Superintendent of Schools, Newburyport, Mass. Early rig, home brew receiver $\frac{1}{4}$ kw rotary spark gap circuit with condensers, etc. First used a crystal, then a four post audion tube. Member ARRL AWA. S.K. 1977.



#686 BARNES, Russell H., Sr., W8DVM, Ex-8ATI. Handle "Russ". Born August 1, 1905. First two way contact July 13, 1926. Occup: Physician in limited general practice and Director of Medical Education, Mansfield General Hospital. Early rig, 2 in. spark coil, quenched spark gap, long wire antenna end fed home brew loose coupler, Galena silicon & carborundum detector, Brandes head phones 1926, windom type Hertz ant. inverted L. fed off-center 165 Watt transformer input to 50 watt tube Hartley circuit with jelly glass lead and aluminum rect. receiver breadboard with Schnell type coil, regen. detector and 2 stage amp. Member of Inter-city Radio Club, Mansfield Ohio, ARRL, OOTC, QCWA (Canton Chapter) Secretary Roster, Ohio Single Sideband Net, Participant eye-bank Net. S.K. 1969.



#687 PEINE, Louis, W5AE, Ex-LP. Handle "Lou". Born July 30, 1900. First two way contact 1913. Occup: Retired from GE 1962. Rice University 1918. Helped to build and operate one of first AM stations in Houston. Taught code and theory during WW1 and WW2, with American Air Lines in 1931. Associated with G.E. in 1934, Field Engineering Tube Sales, thence to Dist. Sales Mgr. in Comms. Equipment Sales Division, Houston. Life Member Houston ARC. In retirement am busy with Ham Radio and Fishing. Hold Commercial Ticket. Early rig, Ford spark coil, Galena. S.K. 1970.



#688 RICHARDSON, Roland D., W6AW, Ex-6AVH. Handle "Rich". Born November 26, 1907. First two way contact 1920. Occup: Retired from Navy Department Civil Service, San Francisco Naval Shipyard. Associated with KBO Broadcast Oakland, 1925. Shipboard Radio Officer 1925-40. At RMCA KPH 1939-40. During WW2 with Navy Dept. Underwater Sound Lab. Former member ARRL, with WAS, WAC, WBE awards. Early rig, loose coupler, crystals, Ford spark coil. Later rotary spark outfit.
