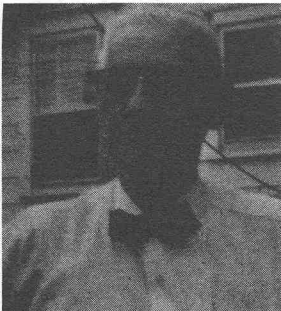

#739 MCVEY, Otto T., W8RZ, Ex-W7RT, K7TF. Handle "Mac". Born March 24, 1905. First 2-way contact, Oct. 1926. Occup: Sub Station Operator for Crucible Steel Co. of America. With the U.S. Army Signal Corps, all ranks from private, Sgt., Communications Liaison with U.S. Navy, to Major. Operator point to point, operator in charge tuning stations and WXO, Craig, Alaska. Chief Op. USAT stations also Governors Island War Dept. Net Stn., Instructor OCS Duty Officer, Liaison, Post Signal, etc. Early rig, regn. recv. using 199 detector plus two stage audio Hartley Xmitter, W.E. WD2 B Batteries for plate supply. Member Triangle Radio Club, ARRL, QCWA, and Civil Defense.



#740 ELLIOTT, Bert, W8OQ. Handle "Bert". Born October 12, 1900. First two way contact, November 25, 1924. Occup: Retired Electrician. Early rig, spark coil ICW transmitter, Xtal detector. Member ARRO.



#741 PLANTZ, Richard H., W8GVB. Handle "Dick". Born September 29, 1904. First two way contact 1920. Occup: Engineering Checker. Member Marion Radio Club 1919-20-21. Moved to Chicago 1921, returned to Marion 1926. I have spent working life in Engineering (Mech.). Never lost interest in amateur radio, brushed up on code and received license and call W8GVB, and have enjoyed amateur radio very much over the years. S.K.
