



#819 LOVIS, Donald B., Ex-WLOG/4, Ex-1NY. Handle "Don". Born March 4, 1899. First two way contact 1913. Occup: retired after 42 years with Bell Telephone System. M.I.T., class of 1921. Active on AM Phone and CW until 1962. Currently (1967) on SSB. WAS in 1952. Code cert. 30 wpm in 1951. In 1950's was Director and Officer of A.R.C. in Wakefield, Mass. Gained Ham experience 1913-1917 with Amateur group in Wakefield. Early rig, 2" spark coil, Leyden jars, Helix, loose coupler, homemade Galena, and Murdock phones for receiving.



#820 TREADAWAY, Eugene H., W5DKR, Ex-5OZ. Handle "Gene". Born October 21, 1905. First two way contact, 1926. Retired from Bell Telephone System, after 46 years service, 25 years as Toll Testboard Operator. Holds commercial license, ARRL SCM for Louisiana 6 years. Alternate Director, ARRL Delta Div. 4 years. Trustee W5FPO, Club Station. Trained many operators for amateur tickets. Early rig, spark Xmtr., with 201 tube, homebrew receiver.



#821 DAVY, Gordon L., K4IKK, Ex-9AFM, W9AFM, W3LOM. Handle "Gordon". Born November 5, 1906. First two way contact 1923. Occup: Special Agent FBI. In radio engineering with FBI since 1942, at FBI laboratory, Washington, D.C. Member QCWA, ARRL, et al. Awarded Ham of year Award by Washington Mobile Radio Club for 1962. First rig, UV-203 Hartley Oscillator with plate voltage from Esco Motor Gen. Set. Receiver homemade super-Regen.



#822 BARR, Forrest L., K6BV, Ex-8AB, W9BLE, W9MLZ. Handle "Forrest". Born February 12, 1895. First two way contact, 1912- Occup: LCDR, USNR retired. Operator on USS Nevada 1917. At Radio Repair Base in Bordeaux, France 1918. Mfg. of radio components. Was operator of commercial and broadcast xmtrs. Recalled to Navy in 1941. Released in 1949. Industrial Electronics 1950-61. Member of ARRL since inception, QCWA, Reserve Ofcra. Assoc. Early rig, 1/4 KW rotary spark, with receiver loose coupler and crystal.



#823 LOUCKS, Ivan H., W3GD/K4GD, Ex-8CTS, 4GD. Handle "Ivan". Born March 30, 1903. First two way contact 1925. Occup: early years engineer, comms. and signals, Assoc'n. fo American Railroads. Was Radio Inspector and Radio Engr., F.C.C. and prior agencies starting in 1931, and was Chief of Amateur and Citizens Radio Division F.C.C. several years prior to retirement in 1965. Six years active duty with U.S. Navy 1941-1946, retiring as Captain. Member ARRL, QCWA, IRE, et al.
