



#850 DRAGOO, Kenneth L., WA4WHP, Ex-W9FZL, 9CDD, W7EMQ, W6QYV. Handle "Ken". Born April 19, 1907. First two way contact, 1922. Occup: retired. B. Ed. ISNU, M.A. Greeley, Doctorate study at U.C. and Stanford. Engineer at KURS, KACW, KGEJ, KQED, KGO, and with RCA. Instructor RDO-TV Engineering Gompers-O'Connell Tech. and at Stanford Univ. Major, Signal Corps WW2. Built major radio stations. New Guinea and Phillipines. M-ember ARRL, IRE, IARU, et al. WAS, WAC, DXCC, et al. Early rig, spark coil Galena, then  $\frac{1}{2}$  KW rotary W9FZL address is long point, Illinois. QSO'd 1921-1925 with the late Ralph Barber, then 9DEU.



#851 GOODMAN, Alfred R., ZS2IQ, Ex-A3Y, A6A, 6IQ. Handle "Alf". Born July 15, 1906. First two way contact 1924. Occup: retired. Was engineer with South Africa Broadcasting Corp. Was Signals Officer in S.A.A. F. during WW2. Held post of Secretary-Treasurer for South African Radio Relay League 1924-1928. Early rig, Regn. receiver and Hartley OSC. Later used fone with plate mod. Active ham and radio engineer through the years.



#852 DUFFY, Charles G., K1FYV. Handle "Charlie". Born August 4, 1898. First two way contact 1919. Occup: retired Foreman, New England Tel. & Tel. Co. 1963. Graduate from old Boston School of Telegraphy (1916) and of Harvard Naval Radio (1918). Worked on new development "Ship to Shore, and Shore to Ship". Maritime Radio Telephone for N.E.T. & T. 1935-1939. Was made Commander of Radio Telephone Fleet in 1935 after Nationwide Broadcast from Grand Banks over WBZ & WJZ via Telco WOU, from SS HEKLA. Member of ARRL, and Telephone Pioneers of America



#853 SEARS, H.A., W5NC Ex-9CPV, W9AFD, W6AER, W5ADH. Handle "Hal". Born September 14, 1903. First two way contact 1921. Occup: retired, with Agriculture and live stock interests. Owned radio shop 1921-22. Marine Radio Operator 1925-29. Aeronautical Radio Operator 1929-34. Oil Exploration, Lab and Field Service 1934-41. Owned and Operated Seismic Instrument Business 1941-1966. Member ARRL, QCWA, A-1 Opr. et al. PAØHAS covers operations in the Hague. Early rig, Spark coil and Galena. Hold ARRL Pub. Svc. Award.



#854 HARTELL, Edward J., W1AKN, Ex-EH, W1BTS. Handle "Ed". Born May 10, 1893. First two way contact 1908. Occup: retired School teacher (1952). Associated with Holtzer Cabot in 1908. Was C.E.M. USN 1917 to 1921, advancing to Warrant Officer. Associated with Boston Trade High 1928-1952. Becoming a Radio Instructor and Department Head Past Pres. South Shore A.R.C., et al. EC and CD Radio Officer Sandwich. Pub. Svc. Award in 1955. Asst. State Director, Army MARS. Early rig, 1" spark coil Xtal Dect. with 2 slide tuner, all homemade. Operates mostly CW, some SSB.
