Was ignition Engr., Chrysler Elec. Engr., Ford Motor. Army Signal Corps. 1940-46, as Lt. Col. PTT Opr. for State of Bavaria Military Govt. 1945, Mftrs. Rep. 1961-66. Member ARRL, QCWA, IEEE, Ann Harbor R.C. et al. Held first advance license issued in 8th District. Early rig, UV202 on 40 meters homebrew receiver.

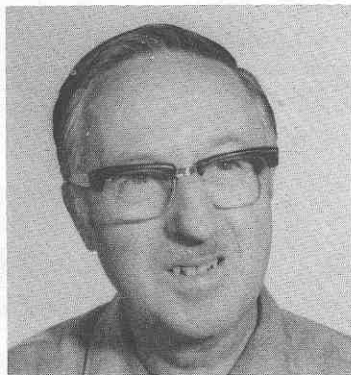


#878 SINGEWALD, Paul H., W3YG, 30V, 3APR, 3ZB, W2GTT, and W3HUIJ. Handle "Paul". Born January 26, 1897. First two way contact 1913. Occup: Comm. 1914. Marine wireless operator Atlantic and Pacific oceans to 1917. USNRF Gunner (R) in WW1. Radio inspector Philadelphia Navy yard. Drexel Institute Elect. Engr., Philadelphia Electric Co. designed and built first radio load dispatching circuit from Philadelphia to Conowings Hydro plant RCA service company. Part-time operator W3TKQ Franklin Institute Museum Radio Station to present. Early rig; Ford coil with electrolytic interrupter in homebrew outfit, receiver 2 slide tuner, galena. One daughter and one grandson.

#879 SHUMAN, George W., Jr. Ex-GS. Handle "George". Born June 4, 1901. First two way contact 1915. Occup: Specialty Equipment Lab. Commercial First Co. Builder of Broadcast station WGV with Interstate Electric Corp. of New Orleans. Was first operator 1923. Sailed as R.O. with CAA as Radio Operator. Early rig, spark coil, loose coupler, Galena. SK



#880 SIEVERS, Wm. F., VK3CB, Ex-A3CB, OA3CB. Handle "Bill". Born August 30, 1902. First two way contact, 1926. Occup: retired. Was flight Lt. in RAAF, Traveler for radio sets. Built receivers. Phone and music on 200 meters until 1938. Member ARRL, WIA, NZART, Moorabbin and district R.C. of Victoria. Early rig, French "R" Tube, 3 coil Meisner ckt., loop mod'n. spark (quenched gap and rotary.)



#881 CHANDLER, Alfred W.H., VK3LC, Ex-VK3WH, A3WH, OAWH, VK3WH. Handle "Alf". Born June 1, 1905. First two way contact, 1926. Occup; retired. Hardward Salesman prior to WW2, was in Royal Australian Air Force WW2. Then had own business as hardward specialist. Associated with Australian Broadcast, starting as Radio Technician 1964-1966. Member WIA, Moorabbin & District R.C., Circulation Mgr. Mag. "Amateur Radio". Early rig, MOPA with 201's, super regn., receiver.
