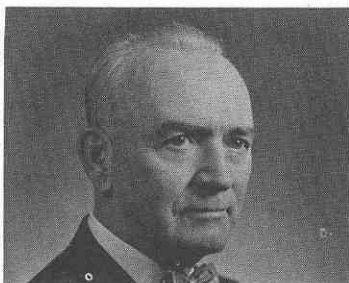
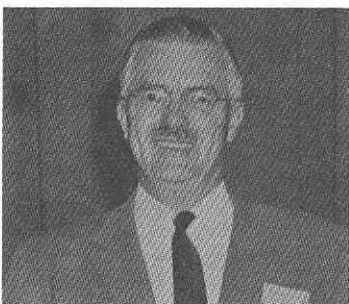

Member ASGB, ARRL, Honorary member SSA, REF, EAF, B.E.R.T.A. WAS, DXCC, DXYL, 1st GYL, WPX (1st GYL).

RM3C rating in 1924. 1968 retired after 40 years as electronics research engineer. Sr. Research Engr. RCA Communications 1927-40. Sr. Engr. Transmitter Design, Federal Tel & Tel Co. 1940-41. Engineer in Charge, Hammarlund Transmitter Div. 1941-48. Admin. Engineer Radio Receptor Co. 1948-50. Research Physicist, Hughes Aircraft Co., 1950-63. Member Radio Club of America ARRL, Sr. member IRE, QCWA. Awarded Bu Ships citation for developing radio counter-measures equipment. Hold 93 patents.
