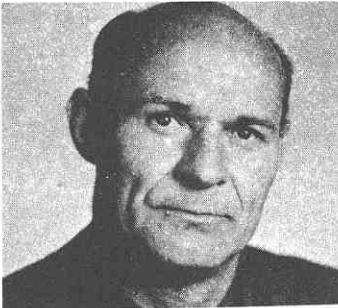




#945 McKINLEY, Donald, Ex-WØOPK

#946 VICKERS, Burnett, V., W1ACZ. Architect self-employed 27 years. Licensed in N.Y., N.J., Conn. and Mass. Hobby radio since 1919. Present home station Collins S Line.



#947 BLAKE, Clayton M., W6AGK/W3BAX. Original 8AGK issued 1920. Held second class commercial telegraph 1926-40; first class radio telephone 1947 to present. Is radio consulting engineer. Built and operated first one way HF police radio system in U.S. in early '30's. He has been working with NASA on radio propagation predictions.



#948 JAQUES, Louis, A., W1KI. Handle "Lou". was originally 1GB in 1914. Holds commercial second grade obtained in 1915. Is in radio and TV repair business. Before WW1 was electrician at GE, Lynn, Mass. Member AWA of New England, NAWA and Quannapowit Radio Assn., Wakefield, Mass. Born Jan. 26, 1896.



#949 SIBERT, Richard E., W8LI. Was original 8LG in 1912. Occup: shoe repair. Had first two way contact in 1910. Handle "Dick". Started with homebrew loose coupler, crystal detector, 1" spark coil, etc. Born February 24, 1897. S.K.

#950 RENTER, Ralph I., W4CU. First two way contact June 6, 1924. Chief Engineer Fed. Comm. Commission, retired in 1968.

#951 STANBACH, William P., W8GPG. Interested in ham radio in 1924. Got second and first class license in 1925. Then did not do much while raising family. Got technical license in 1965.

#952 GARDNER, William K., WØFGZ, WA4LNI. WW2 worked radar at Quonset Naval Station. S.K.
