Frank is a registered professional Engr., has 1st class radiotelephone license was a pioneer designer and manufacturer of police radio equipment. 1942 Frank became an RCA field engineer with Hqs in San Francisco. 18 years later resigned to become a pioneer manufacturer of educational electronic equipment. His patented magnetic tape duplicators are used internationally.



#1241 RICHMAN, Harold R. W4CIZ, exW2CIZ, W2ZZW W4IVQ. Born 1910 first on air 1930. Until retirement (1970-1974) served as engineer in charge of the 24th District field office of the FCC in Washington DC. Retired after 32 years with the commission. Since early 40's has held Radiotelephone 1st, and radiotelegraph 2d class licenses. Member IEEE, QCWA Active in restorations of theatre organs.

#1242 CARPENTER, Burton C, W2RBJ, first on air 1923. He had the usual Ford coil etc for a first transmitter. His receiver was a three slider tuner, a galena crystal detector.

#1245 MANN, Lee, K6KP, ex3JK Born 1909 first on air 1926 Got on the air with a 50 watt tube using Hartley circuit. CW on 40 and 80.
