#1726 ARNELLO, Ben Col. USMC Served in the USMC 1940 to 1961. First license W3ELN first on air 1940. Operated in 1939.



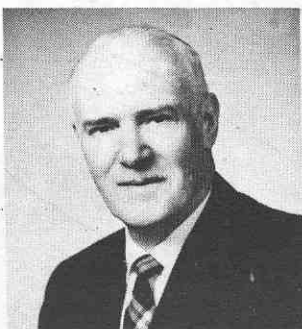
