Has been a transmitter engineer on many C stations.

#1887 MILLER, Herwood N. W30ML exW80ML. Born 8-13-00 First on air 1935.0RS-0PS Penna. State net manager. Post Office Net now extinct.



#1888 BRANSON, Albert W. WA2PTQ Born 9-14-04. First on air 1932. With his father he built receivers. Has some of the old receivers ckts still on hand, date back to days of Armstrong and Atwater Kent WDII tubes UV200 UV201 tubes and crystals also some spark transmittersJoined the Navy and went to Radio School. Served on Navy ships. Then joined the National Guard. Instructed radio school at Ft. Dix 1935-38 Worked for Postal Telegraph in Phila. Worked in shipyard installing radio and radar. C.I.C. Navy Tact., data system till 1962. Retired in 1971.

#1889 DIBBELL, Charles M. W3HTS Born 6-16-96. First on air 1934. Learned Morse code in 1909 while going to High School. Worked as a telegrapher. Got his commercial license and went to sea SS Eastland, SS Minnesota, SS Nevada etc.



#1890 ERICKSON, George M. W5POG, exW9WGT, WØGWI. Born9-23-21.First on air 1936. Worked for the railroad 1941 as caller, telegraphertowerman, train dispatcher, Frisco Lines until 1947. Bell System about 1 yr as asst. test board man. To KATY railroad 1949 as train dispatcher until 1960.Member; Masonic Bodies, Shriner and Past Master 2 terms as OES Patron
