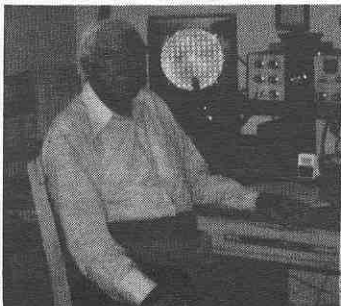
#1901 OVERIN, Courtenay S. W6LVQ Born 1-17-18. First on air 1935 NO INFORMATION
