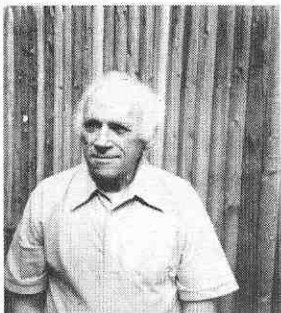


#2032 GARNATZ, Bruno DL7BG exD4BGF First on air 1934 Born 6/23-01

Active until 1936-7 CW operator at WAX 1932. Goodyear airship opns CW opr Ground station 1933-35. American Airlines CW/Phone 1935 1946. AAL engineering Dept., electronics 1946-65. Field Service Engr., 1965 then retired.



#2035 BARNARD, Hutto E. K4NB exW4QV WB4JVC, First on air 1929 Born 9-7-09. Served in USMC & Coast Guard 1929-53.



#2036 FRENCH, Bruce K. W6NPN First on air 1936. Born 4-3-21 World War Two Shipmaster. Retired Los Angeles Port Pilot.



#2037 FOODY, Roy T. W2EPN, ex 8DHF First on air 1923. Born 7-17-07 Retired from NY State Department of Transportation 1976. as an assistant Civil Engr. First license 8DHF. First station was the old Ford Spark Coil, Marconi spark gap and Murdock Oscillation transformer all of which he still has. Rcvr was the Rheinartz circuit using s spider web coil. Antenna 4 wire flat top, an inverted L. mostly on 176 to 200 meters.
