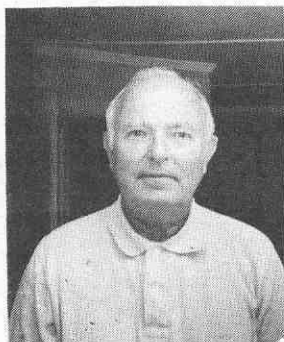

Hobbies; sailing, soaring (gliding) Tennis, golf and of course Ham Radio. WWI navy activities were primarily in the field of anti-submarine training in the Atlantic Theater.

#2059 SIX, John P. W4YPA exW8RIN. Born 5-3-03 First on air 1937. Served in the Navy 1937-39 as RM3c. Qcwa Meritorious, Baltimore and Ohio Radio Club member #21 Charter. Honored 1973 as ham of the Month. QCWA Ohio State Net Control 1968. Moved to Florida and organized the State of Fla., QCWA net 1968. Active in ham radio continuously since first license. Works allbands including 5 meters. Past Secy/Treas. Citrus Chapter QCWA. Master of Ceremony of State Wide Fla., dinner honoring K7UGA Barry Goldwater national President 25th anniversary 1972.

Then went into the Navy as radio opr 1932-36. Then press operator for Press Wireless until 1939 then went into industry in Lab designing coils etc 1947 went into broadcasting full time retired in 1978. 1947 built WHYN-FM, 1950 rebuilt WHYN-AM to higher power. 1951 built WHYN-TV. 1950 was co-designer and builder of was the 2d remote controlled FM station in the country.
