Then instructor & OIC radio section at AAAS. Was commander of 144th Opns Det. in Luzon P.I. Member; SOWP, QCWA, ARRL, OTC, RCC, WAS

#2309 WOODS, T. DeWitt W5FEB exW9FEB WØFEB Born 7-15-01 first on air 1919. Got his BA in physics from Univ of Iowa Was with WSUI Broadcast station Western Union operator for a while, then with Federal Barge Lines radiotelegraph operator.
