 shift radio teletype, direct of R&D CCSI, Consulting  
 Engineer to industry for 15 years, electronics for the  
 plastics industry. Extensive R&D in underwater acoustics  
 (SONAR) for US Navy. Holds patents in foregoing areas.  
 Presently editor and publisher of Long Island DX  
 Bulletin.



#2327 DUNCAN, Frank G. K5YJM exW8SGO, W3SGO, NY4AC, KG6GJ, KG6BMA  
 Born 10-5-08, first on air 1938. Served in the US Navy  
 1941-62 as Commander. Got his AB degree from W.Va State  
 Teachers College. Taught grade school 1929-41. Then Navy  
 duty in electronics and communications until retiring in  
 1962. Served in Europe, Cuba Guam, Hawaii and Alaska.  
 Taught math in high school from 1962 to 1975. Hobbies;  
 antique radio repair, home and grounds upkeep, minor car  
 repair and woodworking.



#2328 HOVER, Jack W5MAV, born 1-19-09, first on air 1930.  
 Commerical operator 1930-37, Worked for Bureau of

 SOWP, ARCA, AWA, IEEE, QCWA, Fellow RCA, ARRL, Returned to  
 Bradley Univ Faculty 1956-69 retired emeritus. Elected  
 Amateur of the year at Dayton Hamvention 1980
