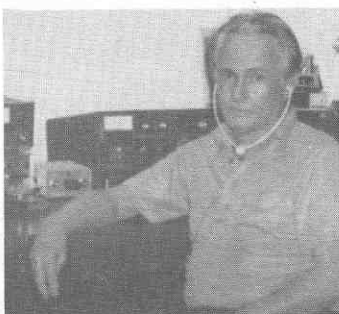


#2406 SPRING, Curt A. W8FDM First on air 1933. Born Dec 8, 1919. XYL Vera, Started to play with radio with a crystal set in 1929 and built a Ford Coil transmitter. Joined the National Guard in 1937 and served in the Infantry 1940-45 2d Lieut. Spent 46 years in the Electrical and Electronic field. Retired from B. F. Goodrich Engineering Department as Sub-Station supervisor in 1982.



#2407 MURMAN, Arvid L. KA6ENH ex6BBE. First on air 1925 Born 1903. First licensed in 1925. Started with a Hartley circuit outfit, was taught radio by a friend who was operator at KOK. Was off the air for a while, then started again.



#2408 WAGNER, Thomas R. W4OSM exW9KVI. First on air 1931 Born Jan 4, 1915. XYL Helen. Was also WØKVI. Built crystal sets, 199 tube receivers etc. Then followed S.W. regen sets. Formed first radio club and Radio Amateur station call W9KVI. Presently volunteer as member of the Handi-ham organization headquartered in Minneapolis. Retired from the Honeywell Corporation in 1977.



#2409 CUSHING, Harold F. W6LXZ exW1EUS. First on air 1932. Born Aug 6, 1910. XYL Mary. Started in 1924 with wire between a friends house 60 feet away. Has held various positions in the US Navy (Electronic Civil Service) and work for private companies, also aircraft and missile and space companies. Retired in 1976



#2410 SELTZER, Louis N. W3COG. First on air 1932. Born 9-25-17. XYL Stefanie has 2 daughters. Served in the US Navy 1942 to 1945. After college had 2 yrs with FCC, then many more Navy Dept. Philco, Hazeltine Corp., and applied Physics Lab of John Hopkins Univ. 1949 founded radio station WCOJ, now the "5000 watt voice of Chester County." 1968 built Cable TV of Chester County a large growing cable-tv system. Looking to retirement so he can travel, spend more time with family and 8½ year old blue eyed blonde daughter. Also holds commercial radiotelephone and radiotelegraph first
