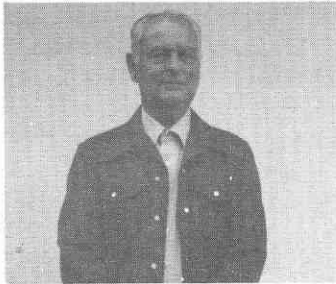




#2431 HENRY, Elwin D. W8UJS First on air 1940 Born 11-24-03

After the war he got on 10 meters and has been mostly  
on 10-15 and 20. Occupation was as a salesman and  
sales manager for a local dairy.

10-5-14. XYL Maxine. 1932 went to commercial radio  
school and got his radiotelephone and radio telegraph

ship to shore radio telephone equipment. 1941 went to  
work for the Air Force installing communications equip-  
ment. 1943-78 Manufacturers rep selling and servicing  
electronic equipment. 1978 retired and moved to  
Scotts Valley. Active on CW and Phone . At present  
operates on 40-20-15 and 10 mostly CW

Born 11-2-07. XYL Betty Interested in "Wireless" in  
1921 at age 14. Started with Ford spark coil and  
crystal detector. 1924 operated on 200 meters later  
went to 80 meters. 100% of his time is on CW  
Enjoys DX contacts and rag chewing, especially with  
old timers.

1943. Born 1-15-21. XYL Beulah, has 2 sons and 2  
daughters. Was with OSS from 1942-46. Had 2½ yrs EE  
Univ., of Illinois, took job in a radio station, became  
Chief Engineer 11 months. Later served in radio & TV  
stations until 1963. Went to work for Collins Radio as  
tech., Correspondent, became amateur Product line  
mgr. Left in 1972 to become sales mgr at R.L. Drake. Back to TV  
1974 until retired in 1983. Has been on RTTY since
