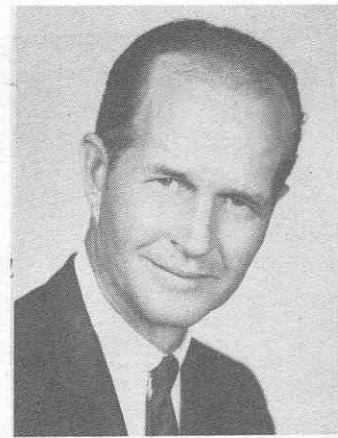
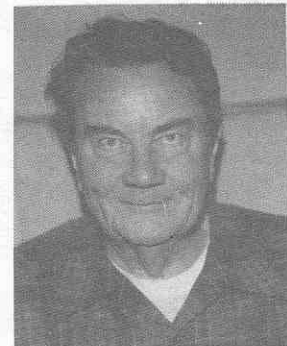


#2496 MONROE, A. L. Jr K5EAP. exW6PUD. First on air 1936

then retired medically.



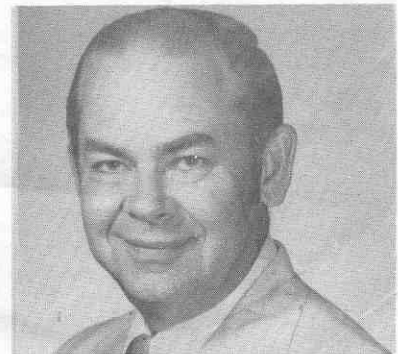
#2497 WYNNE, Thomas A. W6QHL. First on air 1938. Born 3/9/19.
